But from the very beginning, Riley's Parent Partner saw her potential. Each visit followed a consistent routine, which Riley quickly grew to love. They would begin with the skills checklist in her journal—Riley's favorite part—before diving into a storybook and then hands-on activities. This structure gave Riley a sense of comfort and confidence.

One of Riley's biggest motivators? Stickers! Her face would light up every time she earned one for her learning wheel, proudly marking each new skill she mastered. Her excitement was contagious, and her eagerness to learn grew with every visit. In fact, she began waiting by the window, watching for her Parent Partner to arrive.

Over the months, Riley's progress has been nothing short of inspiring. She can now:

- Count confidently to 20
- Name all her colors
- Hold a writing utensil and trace her name
- Say the letters in her name
- · Identify all the shapes on her skills checklist

Even more remarkable is her growth in communication. Riley now participates actively in lessons, with far less repetition and more back-and-forth conversation. Her voice, once an echo, has become a vibrant part of every interaction.
